SB 96 by Sen. Jim Hendren, which passed the Senate last week, is expected to be heard in today's House Public Health, Welfare and Labor Committee. The bill would create the "Health Reform Legislative Task Force" and extend the private option through 2016 but no further without legislative action. The purpose of the Task Force is to consider and recommend various changes to the private option program specifically and to "explore and recommend options to modernized Medicaid programs serving the indigent, aged, and disabled."

STATE CHAMBER/AIA BILL TRACKING

To date the House has filed 237 bills and the Senate has filed 208 bills.

The State Chamber/AIA is tracking 85 bills and resolutions.

New bills added to State Chamber/AIA tracking today:

HB 1214	Eubanks, Jon (R)	Requires production contracts and mortgages related to them to contain notice that additional investments may be required on the part of the grower to complete the terms of the contract.
HB 1219	Hickerson, Mary (R) Hickey, Jimmy (R)	Details factors that may be considered by a municipality for setting consumer rates for water service. Authorizes establishing special rates to assist with community or economic development efforts.
HB 1228	Ballinger, Bob (R) Hester, Bart (R)	Prohibits state actions that burden a person's right to exercise of religion, unless the burden is essential to further a compelling governmental interest; entitles persons to relief against political subdivisions for violations.
HB 1235	Sabin, Warwick (D)	Incorporates investments using convertible financing structures into the award and distribution of equity investment incentive funds and tax credits under the Equity Investment Incentive Act of 2007.
<u>SB 197</u>	Cooper, John (R) Jett, Joe (D)	Exempts from the Freedom of Information Act certain information related to water systems and city-owned utilities, including transmission and delivery plans and information, and customer usage data and personal information.
SB 202	Hester, Bart (R)	Prohibits counties, municipalities, and other political subdivisions from adopting anti-

	Ballinger, Bob (R)	discrimination ordinances on a basis not also contained within state law.
SB 204	English, Jane (R) Brown, Karilyn (R)	Restricts the basis upon which the Attorney General may enter into contingency fee contracts with private attorneys; provides enhanced
		transparency requirements for such contracts.

SB6 by Senate President Jonathan Dismang and House Speaker Jeremy Gillam is on tomorrow's Senate Revenue and Taxation Committee to concur in a House amendment. The full Senate must then concur in the amendment. SB6 makes various changes to income tax tables, sets the capital gains tax exemption at 40 percent beginning February 1 of this year (currently at 50 percent as of 2015), and repeals the 100 percent capital gains tax exemption for gains over \$10 million.

INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMISSION

The Independent Citizens Commission met yesterday to make the following recommendations for salaries for state officials:

- Governor from \$87,759 to \$141,000
- Lt. Governor no recommended change from current \$42,315
- Attorney General from \$73,132 to \$130,000
- Secretary of State from \$54,848 to \$90,000
- Treasurer from \$54,848 to \$85,000
- Auditor from \$54,848 to \$85,000
- Land Commissioner from \$54,848 to \$85,000
- Speaker of the House/Senate President from \$17,771 to \$45,000
- Member of the General Assembly from \$15,869 to \$39,400
- Chief Justice of the Arkansas Supreme Court from \$161,601 to \$180,000
- Justice of the Arkansas Supreme Court from \$149,589 to \$166,500
- Chief Judge of Arkansas Court of Appeals from \$147,286 to \$164,000
- Judge on the Court of Appeals from \$144,982 to \$161,500
- Circuit Judge from \$140,372 to \$160,000
- District Judge from \$125,495 to \$140,000

The recommended salaries for Members of the General Assembly, House Speaker and Senate President include an increase in salary as well as the end of legislative reimbursement for office expenses. This plan would render the office reimbursement of \$14,400, which was previously tax-free, part of a legislator's taxable wages.

The public will have a chance to comment on the recommended salaries.
